Stubb's Legendary Kitchen teams up with Seattle's Union Gospel Mission to Serve up Texas Barbecue for the Homeless on Friday, September 25, 11:30 a.m.

(SEATTLE, Wa.) — Stubb's Legendary Kitchen rolls into Seattle for a stop of its "Feed the World" tour, serving up its famous barbecue to about 300 people experiencing homelessness at Seattle's Union Gospel Mission's Men's Shelter at 318 2nd Ave Ext. South, on **Friday, September 25 at 11:30 a.m.**

The tour, featuring a 34-foot mobile kitchen and museum, has already traveled thousands of miles to feed more than 4,000 of the nation's homeless. In Seattle, Stubb's Legendary Kitchen President and CEO Kurt Koegler, a Stubb's grill master and Mission volunteers will serve smoked and grilled meats made with all-natural Stubb's barbecue sauces and marinades.

"The economy has placed greater demand on organizations like the Seattle's Union Gospel Mission, so we couldn't think of a better time to show our support," Koegler said.
